"Studying the Function of Odorant Receptors"

The sensing of odors is an important ability for humans and other animals; it is closely linked to emotions, behaviors and memories. I am interested in the functional significance of individual odorant receptors (OR), and trying to understand how the information from single OR can precisely be transmitted to specific brain regions and elicit a certain brain function. In this seminar, I will summarize our current efforts and future prospects examining the functional property of OR. I will also discuss the induction of fear response by optogenetic activation of a single type of OR.
