“On Chinese Non-Interventionism”

Dr. Yeophantong advocates a vision of “global governance” based not on the creation of universalizing norms and values *via* modes of governmentality, but on the acceptance of diversity and the legitimacy of difference. According to her, Chinese thinking on governability presents an alternative view of how governance at the interstate level ought to be exercised, going beyond prevailing practices and discourses of global governance as premised upon liberal governmentality.
